May's Themes

WK 3- Growing Flowers 5/4 to 5/8: The children will learn the parts of a flower for example; it's life cycle, seeds, pollination, trees that flower, food that begins as a flower, colors, shapes, and counting using parts of a flower WK 4- Zoo 5/11 to 5/15: Learning about zoos helps children understand the importance of taking care of the environment as it has a significant impact on the lives and welfare of animals. Circle Time

Circle Time is such a great time for children to learn the social skills of being together as a large group AND to learn more about your Space Theme!

WK 3- Growing Flowers

Parts of a Flower

Materials Needed: 1 fresh flower, strips of paper and a marker, 4 pieces of construction paper, artificial flowers dissected.

Show the fresh flower to your child during circle time to introduce our Growing Flowers theme. Pass the flower around to your child to touch and smell and discuss what they notice about the flower. Ask if they know what a flower needs to grow? (Water, air, soil, sun).

Now, point to each part of the flower and ask if they know what it is called. Let them know the name and then print the name on a label and show it to them. Draw a basic picture of that part on the strip of paper and repeat the name. Do this for each part of the flower: Flower, leaf, stem, root. Place these labels on different pieces of paper in the middle of circle. Now pass out pieces of the artificial flowers.

Ask your child to identify which part of a growing flower they have and place it on the proper labeled paper.

WK 4- Zoo

Monkeys Jumping on The Bed!

Make some flannel pieces for each of the characters in the book. I have, in the past, color copied pages from the book and then laminated them and attached Velcro to the back for a flannel board story.

Give your child a monkey and sing the song. Place a bed, the Mama and the Doctor on the flannel board and point to them when you get to that part.

Repeat until all the monkeys are out of the bed and song is finished.





WK 3- Growing Flowers

Finger Painted Flowers

Materials Needed: Finger paint paper, variety of finger paint colors and brown construction paper.

Children can make flowers by using the sides of their fists and use their open hands to make leaves!



WK 4- Zoo

Parrots

Materials needed: bright finger paint colors, paper, brushes.

Trace an oval shape on white paper for the parrot's body. The children paint this with their hands using a bright color. Cut out when dry.

Then, help the children to paint their hands and fingers with a variety of finger paint colors. press on each side of the oval (overlapping on the oval a bit) for feathers.

Add googly eyes.



Math and Manipulatives Activities

WK 3- Growing Flowers

Parts of a Growing Flower

Materials: artificial flowers with most of them "dissected" into parts: flower, stem, leaf.

4 large pieces of paper with the flower parts written on them (flower, stem, leaf, whole flower). Also, draw a basic picture of each next to the label.

The children sort the pieces onto the correct paper.

After sorting, encourage the children to count how many of each part they have. Which do they have more of? Stems? Leaves?


Zoo Memory

The Zoo Theme Park

Provide plastic zoo animals, plastic fences, plastic trees and pieces of blue paper (for water). Have your child build a new zoo park.

Cooking/Snacks Ideas!

Cooking with children helps develop their math skills and helps them to learn how to follow directions. It also allows for some great conversation! Ask many questions while cooking with your children to encourage conversation! Be sure to ask specific theme questions while making these fun snacks!

WK 3- Cooking Vegetable Soup

Ingredients and Items needed: The book *Growing Vegetable Soup*; vegetables from the story and a crock pot.

After reading the story, have the children help you to prepare the vegetables and place them in a crock pot with some vegetable broth. Cook on high (out of their way) for several hours!

WK 4- Monkey Bread (from Pillsbury's site):

Ingredients:

1/2 cup granulated sugar

1 teaspoon cinnamon

2 cans (16.3 oz each) Pillsbury® Grands! ® Home-style refrigerated buttermilk biscuits

1/2 cup chopped walnuts, if desired

1/2 cup raisins, if desired

1 cup firmly packed brown sugar

3/4 cup butter or margarine, melted

Directions

Heat oven to 350°F. Lightly grease 12-cup fluted tube pan with shortening or cooking spray. In large -storage plastic food bag, mix granulated sugar and cinnamon.

Separate dough into 16 biscuits; cut each into quarters. Shake in bag to coat. Arrange in pan, adding walnuts and raisins among the biscuit pieces.

In small bowl, mix brown sugar and butter; pour over biscuit pieces.

Bake 28 to 32 minutes or until golden brown and no longer doughy in center. Cool in pan 10 minutes. Turn upside down onto serving plate; pull apart to serve. Serve warm.
